Judicial independence and its organisational legal guarantees

Key notions: judicial independence, separation of powers, guarantees, substitution of positions, qualifying collegiums, financial and technical support, protection.

The aim of the work is to provide scientific explanation and show practical significance of specifying various aspects of judicial independence, define their substance and make relevant suggestions on how to improve the existing legislation and legal practices in the Republic of Belarus.

Logical analysis methods i.e. analysis, synthesis, induction, deduction and scientific analysis methods i.e. descriptive, historical and comparative methods, sociological, formal and logical legal methods were used during the research. All methods were used in complex and their choice depended on the specific character of the subject and each particular stage of the research.

The research is relevant because in the Republic of Belarus this dissertation is the first complex scientific study of judicial independence and its organisational legal guarantees. It provides definitions for institutional independence and decisional independence of judges, defines their limits, the structure of decisional independence, and presents the classification of judges' independence guarantees. It also provides suggestions on how to improve the current legislation on judicial system organisation and the status of judges and legal practices in the Republic of Belarus.

The results can be used in the process of elaboration of new legal acts that aim at improving the work of Common and Economic courts of the Republic of Belarus, as well as in education while teaching the Judicial System Organisation course and other specialised courses.
